On this Octave Day of the Feast of the Resurrection, Father Rice and I wish you a very blessed and happy Easter. Today is called "Low Sunday" because, compared to the intensity of the Easter Octave, it is a bit less. It is also called "White Sunday" because historically, it was the day that the newly-baptized laid aside their white baptismal garments which they had received the previous Easter Vigil and had been wearing to Mass all week. Some noticed that we had no baptisms or receptions into the Church on the Easter Vigil. This was not for lack of candidates. Because of the priest staffing situation of this past Fall, we were not able to begin the Catholic Inquiry class until late November, which did not leave enough preparation time before Easter. Our class of adults continues to meet and those who choose to enter the Church should be ready to do so in the Fall. Please pray for them.

Father Rice and I are so grateful for everyone who brought Easter food and gifts. We try to write thank you notes for gifts given but it is not always possible especially if it arrives anonymously at the door, or in the Holy Week and Easter rush, we lose track of who brought what. Please accept our thanks for your kindness and be assured of our prayers for you.

The Feast of the Annunciation of the Blessed Virgin Mary, normally celebrated on March 25th (9 months before Christmas), fell during Holy Week this year so it is transferred to the next available day which is tomorrow, Monday, April 8th. It is celebrated with all its privileges as a First Class Feast. In addition to the normal 8 a.m. Low Mass, we will have a High Mass at 6:30 p.m.

Blessings at Saint Stanislaus

The first Sunday of each month: The General Blessing of All Objects, the Blessing of Rosaries, and the Blessing of Expectant Mothers only will be given after each Mass. You may bring any-



thing to be blessed, but items with a special blessing, such as St. Benedict Medals, candles, olive oil, etc. should be blessed with their particular blessings at the times noted below.

The second Saturday of each month: After the 9 a.m. Mass, all blessings will be available, including brown scapular enrollments and other such enrollments.

The Blessing of Salt: There is not a specific blessing for salt, but it is blessed as part of the making of Holy Water. This is done as needed, about every 3 weeks or so. Those wanting blessed salt should put it under the Holy Water tank near the St. Joseph altar, labeled with your name. When the priest makes new Holy Water he will also bless the salt and put an indication on it that it is blessed. Once blessed, the salt will be moved to the Church basement under the lost and found shelf.

When circumstances arise for blessings outside of those times, you are welcome to ask and we will usually be able to accommodate you. We only ask that you do not leave items to be blessed as we cannot be responsible for lost or stolen items.

Our second confessional is complete (except for some decorative woodwork) and in regular use. We live at a time when many people have never encountered a 2-penitent confessional before, so some explanation may be helpful:

- The priest sits in the middle, and a penitent can be on either side of him.
- The penitents do not confess at the same time. There is a sliding door between the priest and each of the two penitent booths, and only one goes to confession at a time. The fact that the priest can begin immediately with the next penitent rather than waiting for one to leave and the next to come can increase the number of confessions we can hear in a given period by up to one third.
- The confessional has been designed and tested for privacy. As long as the penitents whisper, the other one cannot hear. Each penitent booth has a fan running for further privacy.
- When you enter, do not begin your confession until the priest slides open the door for your side. He is likely hearing the confession of the other penitent.
- Only enter the confessional if the green priest light is on. Only enter a penitent booth if the red penitent light is off. The priest will turn off his green light if he has to leave (e.g. for Mass) so do not enter if it is off. If there is still a red light on, that means the priest is finishing up with the final penitent.
