

Sacraments

The Traditional Latin Rites exclusively are offered at St. Stanislaus Parish

Baptisms - Registered and active parishioners should call the office well-ahead of the birth to arrange for the baptism. A class with Father is necessary before the first Baptism in a family at the parish.

Holy Matrimony - Preparation for Marriage must begin at least 6 months prior to the desired date. Weddings are available for parishioners registered and active for six months before the beginning of Preparation for Marriage. Catholics must be married in the Catholic Church to have a valid marriage in the eyes of God and the Church.

First Confession, Confirmation & First Communion - Available for children of registered and active members of the parish. Preparation for these Sacraments for children will be announced in the bulletin. Adults who have not received these Sacraments are invited to call the office to arrange for special preparation by Father.

All parents who are anticipating an upcoming bap-

tism should plan to attend a 30 minute class by Father in the Rectory Basement Classroom (behind the Church basement kitchen) today, Sunday, September 10 from 12:45 until 1:15 p.m. The first time a couple has a child to be baptized at this parish the parents need to attend one of these meetings, regardless of the number of children in the family already baptized. Those registered and regularly attending the parish for some time preceding the baptism may have their child baptized here. This class takes place on the second Sunday of March, June, September and December.

Anyone who is expecting the arrival of a baby but has already taken the Baptism class here is asked to call the parish office at least one month before the birth so we can be sure the necessary paperwork is in order. As a reminder, Godparents must be registered in a parish, practicing their Faith and Confirmed. If they are not registered at St. Stanislaus, a letter from their own Pastor attesting to their eligibility to be a Sponsor is required in advance of the Baptism.
