From Your Priests

Many of our families are new to the Traditional Latin Mass and so “Septuagesima” might not be a familiar word. It is, on the Traditional calendar, the pre-Lenten 2½ weeks before Ash Wednesday during which time we prepare for Lent by thinking and praying about, and deciding how we will observe Lent. The Church’s current requirements are very minimal, and because of the negative influence of the world, the flesh and the devil, each of us needs to have a personal plan to do something extra in the areas of 1) prayer 2) fasting and 3) almsgiving. We should choose something reasonable but regular; i.e. our penances should “sting the flesh” a little each day but also be something that we can do each day. It would be better to choose something small but that we actually could do each of the 40 days. Use these next days to decide upon your specific plan in each of those areas so that you can hit the ground running on Ash Wednesday which is March 5th this year.

This Saturday, at Our Lady of Guadalupe Seminary in Denton, Nebraska, several seminarians will be ordained to the Order of Subdeacon. Subdeacon is considered a Major Order although not a Sacred Order – in other words, it does not confer the Sacrament of Holy Orders, which is first given at the Ordination of Deacons. The new Subdeacons will serve in that role for just a couple of months before they are scheduled to be ordained Deacons.

Saturday, February 22nd is the feast of the Chair of Saint Peter, Apostle. It is a particularly important day in apostolates of the Priestly Fraternity of St. Peter as it reminds us to renew our devotion and submission to St. Peter the first Pope and his successors. You are encouraged to attend Mass on this day to give thanks to Almighty God for the graces He gives us, especially through the intercession of our heavenly patron, St. Peter. Because of their close connection in life, St. Paul is always commemorated on the feasts of St. Peter and vice versa. This is a 1st Class Feast in all Priestly Fraternity of Saint Peter (FSSP) houses and Churches, and we will have a Solemn High Mass at 10:30 a.m. in addition to the 9:00 a.m. Low Mass. By decree of the Sacred Apostolic Penitentiary, dated June 7, 2008, a plenary indulgence is also granted at the usual conditions to the members of the Confraternity of St. Peter (CSP) on this day, just for being a CSP member (under the usual conditions).

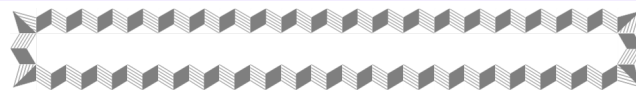

Ash Wednesday and the beginning of Lent is March 5th. You may bring last year's and older palms which we will burn to make the ashes for Ash Wednesday. Please put them in the container in the vestibule. Please bring them early because we will not accept any others after March 2nd.



The Sacrament of Penance (Confession) can be received whenever needed or desired by a baptized Catholic, unlike other Sacraments which have limits (such as Confirmation and Holy Communion). The saints generally recommend that we go at least monthly. Going every couple of weeks is a good practice to receive the graces to avoid sin. Making “Confessions of Devotion” (e.g. with only venial sins or imperfections) more than every week or two should not normally be done. A person with only venial sins can have those forgiven with an Act of Contrition. There can be a danger of developing scruples with too-frequent confessions. In our situation, it is also a matter of charity. Many people drive even hours to come to Mass and many do not have opportunities for confession where they live. Those who are able to go to confession during the week (even with a little sacrifice) should strive to do so since the number of confessions that can actually be heard on Sunday is fewer than the number desiring the Sacrament.

Whenever one of the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, First Holy Communion or Matrimony is received or when someone is received into Full Communion at Saint Stanislaus, a certificate of that Sacrament should be issued to the recipient. If you have received one or more of these Sacraments here and did not receive a certificate, please contact the office so we can send it. Please note that the Diocese requires us to check a copy of the birth certificate for Baptisms, so if you have not provided us a copy, please do so and we will send the baptismal certificate. Please do not send the original birth certificate. A scanned copy by email would suffice.



All couples who are anticipating an upcoming baptism are invited to attend a 30-minute class by Father in the Rectory Basement Classroom (behind the Church basement kitchen) on **Sunday, March 9** from 12:45 until 1:15 p.m. The first time a couple has a child to be baptized at this parish the parents need to attend one of these meetings, regardless of the number of children in the family already baptized. This class normally takes place on the second Sunday of March, June, September, and December.

Statements of Contributions for all who donated to the parish by check or in a marked envelope for the year 2024 have been sent in the US Mail. If you did not receive yours, please contact the office. Since we record hundreds of contributions each year, some mistakes are inevitable, although we try hard to record every one accurately. If you find mistakes on your statement, please call or email the office and we will be happy to send you a corrected copy right away.

Sacraments

The Traditional Latin Rites exclusively are offered at St. Stanislaus Parish

Baptisms - Parishioners, registered and active for at least four months, should call the office well ahead of the birth to arrange for the baptism of their newborn. A class with Father is necessary before the first Baptism in a family at the parish.

Holy Matrimony - Preparation for Marriage must begin at least 6 months prior to the desired date. Weddings are available for parishioners registered and active for six months before the beginning of Preparation for Marriage. Catholics must be married in the Catholic Church to have a valid marriage in the eyes of God and the Church.

First Confession, Confirmation & First Communion - Available for children of registered and active members of the parish. Preparation for these Sacraments for children will be announced in the bulletin. Adults who have not received these Sacraments are invited to call the office to arrange for special preparation by Father.

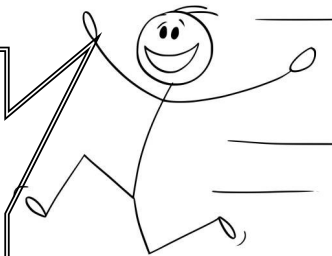

New Hampshire Reporting Requirements

Did you know? In New Hampshire, it is the responsibility of all adults (not just doctors, school counselors, therapists, ministers, etc.) to report suspected abuse or neglect of a minor (a child under the age of 18) to the Division for Children, Youth & Families (800-894-5533). Failure to report suspected abuse or neglect is a misdemeanor.

Blessings at Saint Stanislaus

The first Sunday of each month:



The General Blessing of All Objects, the Blessing of Rosaries, and the Blessing of Expectant Mothers only will be given after each Mass. You may bring anything to be blessed, but items with a

special blessing should be blessed with their particular blessings at the times noted below.

The second Saturday of each month:

After the 9 a.m. Mass, all blessings will be available, including brown scapular enrollments and other such enrollments.

The Blessing of Salt:

Those wanting salt blessed should put it under the holy water tank near the St. Joseph altar, labeled with your name. Once blessed, the salt will be moved for pick-up to the Church basement under the lost and found shelf. **Please do not put salt under the holy water tank unless the tank is less than ¼ full, to prevent a pile-up of salt weeks before it will be blessed.**
