everything needed for beautiful ceremonies.

This Wednesday, at Our Lady of Guadalupe Seminary in Nebraska, His Excellency Robert Reed, Auxiliary Bishop of Boston, will ordain five priests for the FSSP. Please pray for these five Deacons during their final days of preparation to become Priests forever according to the order of Melchezidek.

And my update on the last projects from our Ad Altare Dei Capital Campaign. A contract has been signed with North Branch Construction, who did our structural work last summer. This contract is to install a Limited Access, Limited Use (LULA) Lift (basically, a smaller **elevator** for up to 3-4 people), the demolition and new construction of **new** restrooms and a kitchen and new air conditioners for the Church. The LULA will be installed in a new addition that will be built on the front corner of the Church and will include a completely new and relocated indoor stairwell providing access from the street, down to the Church basement and up to the Church. This will be in addition to the current steps leading up to the main entrance. The current "kitchen" will be demolished and three new restrooms will be installed there; one men's, one women's (both with several stalls) and an accessible family restroom. The current location of the restrooms will be demolished and a new "real" kitchen will be built there, with oven/stove, hood, serving and prep areas, etc. Today, we had a detailed planning meeting with North Branch and our architect/engineer. Visible work on these projects will hopefully begin mid-August and will progress at a rapid pace once work is begun. Right now, they are working on permits, meeting with the City of Nashua, final planning and budgeting and other less-glamourous but most necessary aspects of the projects.

SUMMER ATTIRE REMINDER

Sacraments

The Traditional Latin Rites exclusively are offered at St. Stanislaus Parish

Baptisms - Parishioners, registered and active for at least four months, should call the office well ahead of the birth to arrange for the baptism of their newborn. A class with Father is necessary before the first Baptism in a family at the parish.

Holy Matrimony - Preparation for Marriage must begin at least 6 months prior to the desired date. Weddings are available for parishioners registered and active for six months before the beginning of Preparation for Marriage. Catholics must be married in the Catholic Church to have a valid marriage in the eyes of God and the Church.

First Confession, Confirmation & First Communion - Available for children of registered and active members of the parish. Preparation for these Sacraments for children will be announced in the bulletin. Adults who have not received these Sacraments are invited to call the office to arrange for special preparation by Father.
