Please make Father Harkins who is from Scotland feel very welcome. The Bursar is responsible for the money, and it is a thankless job that he does very well. Father will be flying out this afternoon to join the rest of us Fraternity priests for the meeting in Nebraska. I will return for 7 a.m. Mass this Friday. Until then, there will be no Daily Masses.

I again thank you and request your patience as I am diligently trying very hard to get caught up on correspondence. I am still very behind in answering all the emails and re-

quests for information through the website. I am happy to announce that I have hired a part-time Bookkeeper who will work one day each week keeping the books, paying bills and recording the contributions. Patricia (Pat) Wixon also works at Resurrection Parish here in Nashua and she is very familiar with the Diocese of Manchester accounting system and procedures. She is working to enter all contributions given by check or envelope since our first Mass on August 7 so that all who have given will get proper credit for tax purposes at the end of the year. Once this is completed, all who are registered in the parish will be able to access their contributions on record through their personal accounts on the parish registration website. That is just one of many reasons why I would like to strongly request that everyone who is attending here registers. Even if you are from out of the diocese or are remaining registered at another parish, signing up here will help us to accurately show the Diocese the interest and commitment to the parish. It will help me to be able to accurately contact you when necessary and keep you informed about important parish news. It is also a necessary prerequisite to receiving Sacraments such as Baptisms, First Communion, Confirmation, Holy Matrimony and Extreme Unction here as well. Several people have expressed an interest in donating vestments or money to have vestments made. 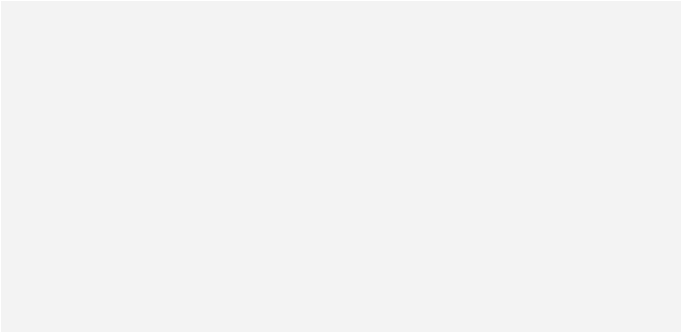
